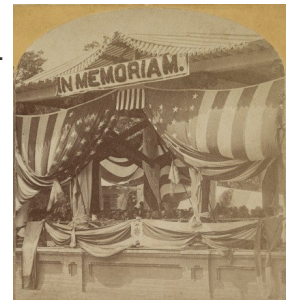

In the waning years of the Civil War (1861–1865) and immediately afterward, communities in the North and South, Black and White, decorated soldiers' graves with floral honors on springtime "decoration days." The practice of strewing flowers on graves has been documented from Classical Roman times to western Europe in the nineteenth century.



On May 5, 1868, the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), a politically powerful organization of Union veterans led by Major General John A. Logan — issued General Orders No. 11 or the "Memorial Day Act." This issuance formally established "Memorial Day" as a Decoration Day on which the nation would remember its war dead and decorate their graves with flowers.

In subsequent decades competition flourished to claim when and where the first such gathering occurred — in one way or another. Recent scholarship, however, points to the ladies of Columbus, GA, who in April 1866 lobbied for a clearly defined Memorial Day on which to place flowers on the graves of Civil War dead.

FROM THE LIBRARY

"Apples Never Fall" by Liane Moriarty is an intriguing Mothers Day book to read. It centers on the Delaney family, once well-known in their community for running a successful tennis academy. Joy and Stan Delaney are now retired, their four adult children - Amy, Logan, Troy, and Brooke are each shaped in different ways by their competitive upbringing and their parents' complicated marriage.

The story begins when a mysterious young woman named Savannah shows up at the Delaneys' door, claiming to need help. Joy invites her in, and she gradually becomes part of their household. Soon after, Joy disappears without explanation (which seems a little implausible to me) leaving behind her phone and a growing sense that something is very wrong.

As the police begin to investigate Joy's disappearance, suspicion falls on Stan. At the same time, long-buried tensions among the Delaney siblings resurface. Each child has a different perspective on their parents' marriage—some seeing love, others remember their father's controlling nature, resentment, and emotional strain. Their conflicting memories raise questions about what really went on behind closed doors. The book brings out the fact that children carry forward patterns of thought and behavior learned from their parents - "the apple never falls far from the tree"

None of the characters are likable. The mother is an enigma, the father is a perfectionist, mean tempered and controlling. The children love each other and their parents, but seem spoiled, indulged, and competitive with each other. However, Liane Moriarty is one of my favorite authors for domestic drama. She often throws in suspense and a mystery while adding some humor as well.

The gossipy way the grown kids talk about their parents is so funny - These "children" are in their 30's and 40's, yet they speak as if their parents, tennis partners who are 70 & 69, are ancient and getting a little loopy! The reader sees exactly what each character is thinking but none of them seem to be a very reliable narrator.

I am not a tennis player, but I thought all the info and back story about tennis made the story more interesting. In fact, I enjoyed reading this so much that I didn't even care if they ever found the mother who went missing!

PINEAPPLE POKE BUNDT CAKE

| 1 box (2 layer) yellow cake | 2 T. vanilla |
| 1 pkg. (4 serving) instant vanilla pudding | 1 c. confectioners sugar |
| ¾ c. veg. oil | 1 T. melted butter |
| 4 eggs | |
| 1 can (20 oz.) crushed pineapple, well drained and save juice | |

Beat cake mix, pudding, eggs, oil & ¾ c. pineapple juice for 2 min. Add 1 T. vanilla. Fold in crushed pineapple. Spray bundt pan, sprinkle bottom & sides with sugar. Pour batter into pan. Bake 350 deg. for 35-40 min. Combine remaining pineapple juice, confectioners sugar and melted butter and 1 T. vanilla. When cake is done, remove from oven and set on wire rack. Poke holes in cake with skewer at ½ in. intervals while still hot. Pour pineapple juice mixture over cake. Allow to cool in pan 30-40 min.

Hello, all! Spring has sprung, and with it, the delight of being a Florida resident for another year.

We have had a busy winter season, and I want to again say thank you to all the volunteers for being great volunteers! A few folks told me after the Volunteer appreciation lunch, that they didn't go, because they felt like they had not earned a place at the table. I feel that if you do anything positive for the Colony, without needing reimbursement, that you are in fact a volunteer. Folks have physical limitations. I ask for help for things that at one point, I could have done completely by myself...after working full time and tending to my family. We can all use a little help from time to time. If you are interested at all in the activities that go on here, attend a meeting. A lot of good ideas and great times start with an activities meeting. I meet new people all the time, that live right here in the Colony, thru activities. Please come and be a part of our active neighborhood.

A new subject has come to the Colony, and that is Neuroplasticity. Several of us met as a group last month to decide how we would bring the subject to life here. Look it up on social media, web searches and/or You Tube videos (my favorite). Basically, it is the brain's ability to carve/create a new pathway when we learn something new. People can create new neural pathways during their entire lifespan. It is by this same process that people re-learn to do basic things after an injury. We are always making new branches and therefore new paths. At the same time, old/ unused paths become dormant and are removed. We will be putting sign-up sheets in the clubhouse in the Fall, one for teaching a new skill, and one for learning a new skill. We will give opportunity for each and see if we can match up teachers with students. We already do this to some degree. The guidelines for learning thru a neuroplastic process, is that the activity be repeatable, done with intent and eventual accuracy, and in the company of others. Knitting is just one example, and yes, we do that here. Our Colony is loaded with intellect and skill. Share what you know, learn what you don't and be healthier for it.

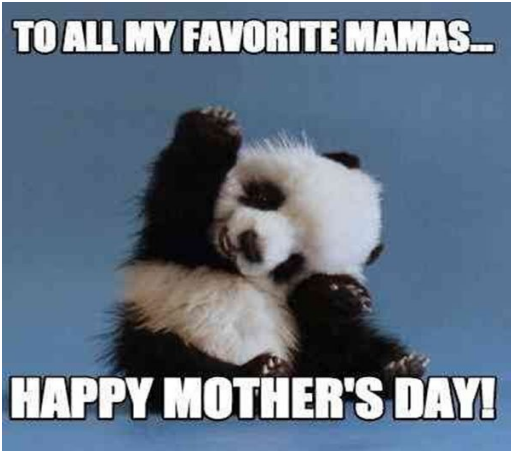

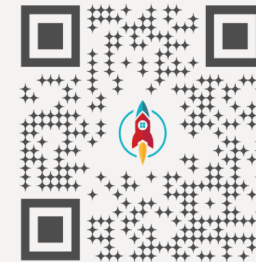

THIS MONTH IN AMERICAN HISTORY

May 1, 1960 - An American U-2 spy plane flying at 60,000 feet was shot down over Sverdlovsk in central Russia on the eve of a summit meeting between President Dwight D. Eisenhower and Soviet Russia's Premier Nikita Khrushchev. The sensational incident caused a cancellation of the meeting and heightened existing Cold War tensions.

May 2, 2011 - U.S. Special Operations Forces killed Osama bin Laden during a raid on his secret compound in Pakistan. The raid marked the culmination of a decade-long manhunt for the elusive leader of the al-Qaeda terrorist organization.

May 5, 1893 - The Wall Street Crash of 1893 began as stock prices fell dramatically. By the end of the year, 600 banks closed, and several big railroads were in receivership

May 5, 1961 - Alan Shepard became the first American in space. He piloted the spacecraft *Freedom 7* during a 15-minute 28-second suborbital flight that reached an altitude of 116 miles (186 kilometers) above the earth

May 6, 1937 - The German airship Hindenburg burst into flames at 7:20 p.m. as it neared the mooring mast at Lakehurst, New Jersey, following a trans-Atlantic voyage

May 14, 1607 - The first permanent English settlement in America was established at Jamestown, Virginia, by a group of royally chartered Virginia Company settlers from Plymouth, England

May 14, 1942 - During World War II, an Act of Congress allowed women to enlist for noncombat duties in the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps (WAAC), the Women Appointed for Voluntary Emergency Service (WAVES), Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS), and Semper Paratus Always Ready Service (SPARS), the Women's Reserve of the Marine Corp.

May 17, 1792 - Two dozen merchants and brokers established the New York Stock Exchange. In good weather they operated under a buttonwood tree on Wall Street. In bad weather they moved inside to a coffeehouse to conduct business.

May 17, 1875 - The first Kentucky Derby horse race took place at Churchill Downs in Louisville.

May 20, 1927 - Charles Lindbergh, a 25-year-old aviator, took off from Roosevelt Field, Long Island, in the *Spirit of St. Louis* attempting the first solo nonstop flight between New York City and Paris. Thirty-three hours later, after a 3,600 mile journey, he landed at Le Bourget, Paris, earning the nickname "Lucky Lindy" .

May 20, 1932 - Amelia Earhart became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic. She departed Newfoundland, Canada, at 7 p.m. and landed in Ireland. Five years later, along with her navigator Fred Noonan, she disappeared while trying to fly her twin-engine plane around the equator.

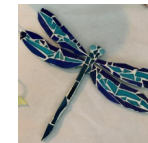

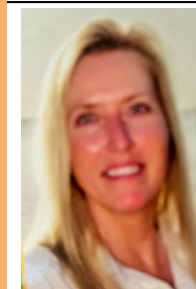
