The United States celebrates 250 years of independence in 2026, marking 250 years since the Declaration of Independence in 1776.

The United States is considered to have been founded on **July 4, 1776**, when the **Declaration of Independence** was adopted by the Second Continental Congress in Philadelphia, formally declaring the thirteen American colonies independent from British rule. This date is widely recognized as the birth of the nation, even though the Revolutionary War continued until 1783 and the Constitution was not ratified until 1787.

Historical Context

The Declaration of Independence, primarily authored by **Thomas Jefferson**, was the culmination of growing colonial resistance to British taxation and control. The **Lee Resolution**, passed on July 2, 1776, formally voted for independence, and the Declaration was publicly proclaimed on July 4, 1776. The Revolutionary War that followed solidified the colonies' independence, and the Treaty of Paris in 1783 officially ended the conflict.

250th Anniversary

In 2026, the United States marks its **250th anniversary**, celebrating the nation's founding and its historical journey. Events include commemorative parades, exhibitions, and educational programs highlighting the contributions of the Founding Fathers, revolutionary battles, and the evolution of American democracy.

Distinction Between Independence and Constitution

While independence was declared in 1776, the **U.S. Constitution**, which established the federal government and legal framework, was signed in **1787** and ratified by the states thereafter. Therefore, the 250-year celebration specifically honors the **Declaration of Independence**, not the Constitution, which is about 239 years old as of 2026. In summary, **America was "founded" in the sense of declaring independence 250 years ago**, and the 2026 celebrations commemorate this historic milestone, recognizing the beginning of the United States as a sovereign nation.

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FRENCH TOAST BAKE

- 1/2 c. melted butter (1 stick)

1 c. brown sugar

1 loaf of thickly sliced bread

4 eggs
- 1 1/2 c. milk

1 tsp. vanilla

powdered sugar for sprinkling

cinnamon for sprinkling

Melt butter in microwave and add brown sugar, stir till mixed. Pour butter/sugar mix into bottom of 9x13 pan and spread around. Beat eggs, milk & vanilla. Lay single slices of bread in pan. Spoon 1/2 of egg mixture on bread layer. Sprinkle with cinnamon over bread/eggs. Add 2nd layer of sliced bread. Spoon on remaining egg mixture. Cover and chill in fridge overnight. Bake at 350 deg. (covered for the first 30 min.) Uncovered for 15 min. Total 45 min. Sprinkle with powdered sugar and cinnamon. Serve with warm maple syrup.

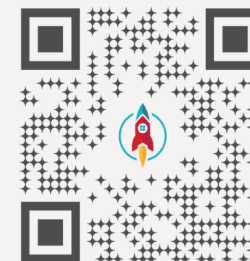
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THIS MONTH IN AMERICAN HISTORY

July 1, 1862 - President Abraham Lincoln signed the first income tax bill, levying a 3% income tax on annual incomes of \$600-\$10,000 and a 5% tax on incomes over \$10,000. Also on this day, the Bureau of Internal Revenue was established by an Act of Congress.

July 1, 1863 - Beginning of the Battle of Gettysburg during the American Civil War.

July 2, 1776 - The Continental Congress in Philadelphia adopted a resolution, "Resolved, That these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved.

July 2, 1964 - President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act of 1964, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race in public accommodations, publicly owned or operated facilities, employment and union membership and in voter registration.

July 6, 1885 - Louis Pasteur gave the first successful anti-rabies inoculation to a boy who had been bitten by an infected dog.

July 8, 1776 - The first public reading of the Declaration of Independence

July 9, 1868 - The 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified. The Amendment defined U.S. citizenship and prohibited individual States from abridging the rights of any American citizen without due process and equal protection under the law. The Amendment also barred individuals involved in rebellion against the U.S. from holding public office.

July 16, 1945 - The experimental Atomic bomb "Fat Boy" was set off at 5:30 a.m. in the desert of New Mexico desert, creating a mushroom cloud rising 41,000 ft. The bomb emitted heat three times the temperature of the interior of the sun and wiped out all plant and animal life within a mile.

July 16, 1969 - The Apollo 11 Lunar landing mission began with a liftoff from Kennedy Space Center at 9:37 a.m.

July 18, 1947 - President Harry Truman signed an Executive Order determining the line of succession if the president becomes incapacitated or dies in office.

July 20, 1969 - A global audience watched on television as Apollo 11 Astronaut Neil Armstrong took his first step onto the moon. As he stepped onto the moon's surface he proclaimed, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

July 24, 1945 - At the conclusion of the Potsdam Conference in Germany, Winston Churchill, Harry Truman and China's representatives issued a demand for unconditional Japanese surrender. The Japanese, unaware the demand was backed up by an Atomic bomb, rejected the Potsdam Declaration on July 26.

July 27, 1953 - The Korean War ended with the signing of an armistice by U.S. and North Korean delegates at Panmunjom, Korea. The war had lasted just over three years.

July 30, 1975 - Former Teamsters Union leader James Hoffa was last seen outside a restaurant near Detroit, Michigan.

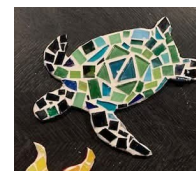

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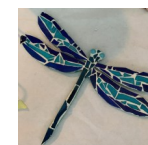

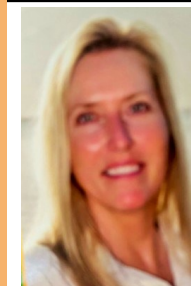

This historical novel blends documented history, local Cape Cod legend, and fiction to tell the story of pirate Samuel Bellamy, his beloved Mariah Hallett, and the famous pirate ship Whydah Gally.

The novel begins with Sam Bellamy as an ambitious young sailor who dreams of earning enough wealth to marry Mariah and provide her with a secure future. Frustrated by the limited opportunities available to ordinary working men, he is drawn into the dangerous world of treasure hunting and eventually piracy. What starts as a means to an end becomes an obsession as he spends eighteen months raiding ships throughout the Caribbean under the black flag.

The author uses real names for the characters and actual places for the settings. The glossary at the back of the book provides the background for the authentic words and phrases commonly used during the 1700's.
