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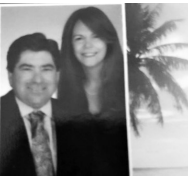

½ c. sugar	¼ c. raisins
3 eggs plus 1 egg yolk (save white)	1 T. grated lemon peel
1 c. softened margarine	2 tsp. salt
3 ½ c. flour	1 egg separated

Dissolve yeast in water. Add salt, sugar eggs and egg yolk, Stir to mix. Add margarine, 1 ½ c. flour and blend for ½ minutes and beat at medium speed for 10 minutes. Stir in remaining flour, fruit, nuts. Cover and let rise until it doubles in size. Cut in half and place on greased cookie sheet. Beat reserve egg white slightly beaten with water and brush over stollen. Let rise until double. Bake at 375 ° fir 20-25 minutes.

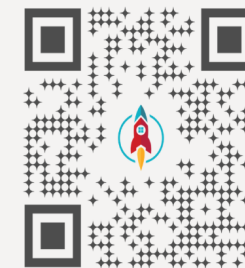

THIS MONTH IN AMERICAN HISTORY

September 2, 1945 - President Harry Truman declared V-J Day (Victory over Japan Day) commemorating the formal Japanese surrender

September 2, 1963 - Alabama Governor George Wallace forcibly halted public school integration by encircling Tuskegee High School with state troopers.

September 3, 1783 - The Treaty of Paris was signed by John Adams, Ben Franklin and John Jay, formally ending the American Revolutionary War.

September 4, 1886 - The last major U.S.-Indian war came to an end as Geronimo was captured. He died of natural causes in 1909 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

September 8, 1565 - The first Catholic settlement in America was founded by Spaniard Don Pedro Menendez de Aviles at St. Augustine, Florida.

September 8, 1900 - A hurricane with winds of 120 mph struck Galveston, Texas, killing over 8,000 persons, making it the worst natural disaster in U.S. history.

September 8, 1974 - A month after resigning the presidency in disgrace as a result of the Watergate scandal, Richard Nixon was granted a full pardon by President Gerald R. Ford for all offenses committed while in office.

September 9, 1776 - The United States came into existence as the Continental Congress changed the name of the new American nation from the United Colonies.

September 11, 2001 - The worst terrorist attack in U.S. history occurred as four large passenger jets were hijacked then crashed, killing nearly 3,000 persons.

September 13, 1814 - The Battle of Fort Henry in Baltimore Harbor occurred, observed by Francis Scott Key aboard a ship. He watched the British attack overnight and at dawn saw the American flag still flying over the fort, inspiring him to write the verses which became the U.S. National Anthem in 1931.

September 16, 1620 - The Mayflower ship departed from England, bound for America with 102 passengers and a small crew. The ship reached Provincetown, Massachusetts on November 21st. The Pilgrims disembarked at Plymouth on December 26th.

September 18, 1947 - The U.S. Air Force was established as a separate military service. By nightfall 26,000 men were dead, wounded, or missing.

September 20, 1873 - The New York Stock Exchange was forced to close for the first time in its history as a result of a banking crisis during the financial Panic of 1873.

September 25, 1789 - The first U.S. Congress proposed 12 Amendments to the Constitution, ten of which, comprising the Bill of Rights, were ratified.

September 26, 1960 - The first-ever televised presidential debate occurred between presidential candidates John F. Kennedy and Richard M. Nixon. Many who watched were inclined to say Kennedy 'won' the debate, while those who listened only to the radio thought Nixon did better.

September 27, 1964 - After a 10-month investigation, the Warren Commission Report was issued stating a lone gunman was responsible for the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

September 29, 1789 - Congress created the United States Army, consisting of 1,000 enlisted men and officers.

THE HOW TO DO IT CORNER

In order to keep your clothes dryer operating safely and at its optimum, it is necessary to keep the vent line clean and free of excessive lint buildup. Lint will restrict air flow and can be a fire hazard. Before we get to the cleaning process, let's briefly discuss the vent line itself.

The vent line that penetrates and routes through the wall, ceiling, floor, under the house and in the attic should be smooth wall, rigid metal such as aluminum or thin wall sheet metal and never pvc (plastic) or ribbed flexible. Ribbed hose collects lint. The flexible ribbed hose should only be used from the dryer outlet to the penetration. Always vent to the exterior and install a backdraft damper, but no screens on the outlet end.

To clean the line, you can run a flexible lint brush through the vent line from the inside by disconnecting your dryer. Push the brush completely through the line to push the lint out. Use a battery powered or electric blower to blow out the line. I recommend doing this every 6 months. Clean lint from the backdraft damper monthly or more often. You can do this yourself or hire a handy man.

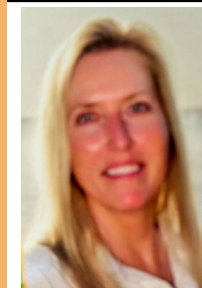
